

## The "French" Pillowcase

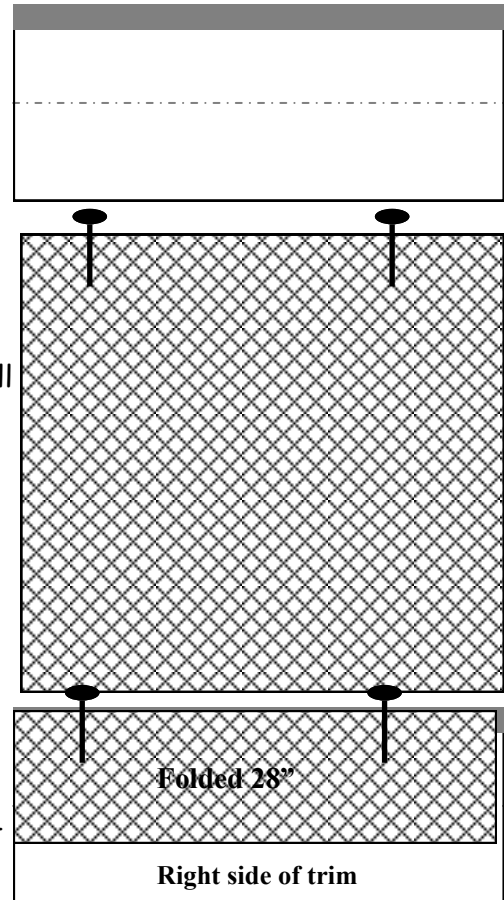
### Materials:

- .7m main fabric-cut 28"xwof
- .3m contrast fabric-cut 10" x wof
- .1m trim -cut 1½" x wof

Wof = width of fabric

### Instructions:

1. Press 10" contrast in half, wrong sides together.
2. Press 1½" trim in half wrong sides together.
3. Open up the 10" contrast and place wrong side down.
4. Place 1½" trim (folded) against one edge of the right side of the contrast.
5. Place 28" piece next on top of the trim, lining up all raw edges.
6. Pin in place temporarily with pins vertically placed.
7. Roll the 28" piece to about 3" wide to reveal the trim that is underneath.
8. Bring bottom side of trim up to pins and re-pin all layers.
9. Stitch ¼" seam catching all layers.
10. Turn tube right side out and press in half-right side out.
11. Trim edges even.
12. Sew the two sides around outer end of the pillowcase with an ⅛" seam allowance with wrong sides together.
13. Turn inside out and sew the 2 sides again creating a "French" seam.
14. Turn right side out and press.
15. Enjoy!



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
